Day Two - The Forums

On Thursday, the RTA General Business Session and Welcome will commence at 8 a.m. with a keynote address from Jonathan Mackay, senior macro strategist with Morgan Stanley. Responsible for providing strategy and advice to the firm's sales force and clients on all aspects of credit investing, Mackay is author of various in-depth

reports including the monthly Credit Report, Basis Points and Dealing with Today's Markets report.

Mackay will be followed by a railroad investment analysis from ABH Consulting's Tony Hatch and the first of two sessions titled, "Procurement, Resource and Uti-

presentations from some of the industry's largest integrated sawmill operations. This geographically diverse forum will provide an indepth look at what sawmills face in today's changing world of hardwood supply.

RTA's keynote luncheon address will be made by Federal Railroad Administrator Joseph C. Szabo. Szabo leads a staff of more than 900 professionals who develop and enforce safety regulations; manage financial assistance programs; and oversee research and technology development programs.

The D.C. Activities and Associations Forum will feature updates on the safety initiative recently undertaken by the American Short Line and Regional Railroad Association as well as the rail industry's legislative initiatives.

The Engineering Forum and address by the president of the American Railway Engineering and Maintenance of Way Association will follow with updates from Norfolk Southern, Burlington Northern Santa Fe, CSX Transportation and Canadian National.

The highlight of the evening will be the Annual RTA Banquet and Awards Ceremony, where attendees will enjoy the improvisational talents of the On The Spot crew of performers. The performers will interact with the audience for a "Whose Line Is It Anyway" themed event that will see performers take suggestions from the audience to create songs and sketches.

Day Three - The Research

On Friday, business will kick off at 8 a.m., with the Research Forum, where attendees will hear from experts on a variety of wood preservation topics and the development of a test methodology for assessing the effects of preservative treatments on the dimensional stability of railroad ties. In addition, now that the RTA-AWPRP alternative wood preservative research program is in its sixth year, this year's update will illustrate some of the differences now beginning to appear in the test samples.

Always awaited with anticipation, the Railroad Purchasing Forum will allow the Class I railroads to share their purchasing plans for the coming year.

Optional Fun

There are a couple of optional activities to enjoy during the conference, including a "Keys to the Kingdom Tour" of Walt Disney World. The 4.5-hour walking tour includes stops at backstage facilities and a variety of favorite attractions.

Guests might also enjoy a tour of Winter Park. The tour will include a scenic boat ride; a stop at the Morse Museum of American Art, which is filled with the jewelry, pottery, paintings, art glass, stained glass windows, lamps and chapel interior of Louis Comfort Tiffany; and a visit to the Park Avenue shopping district to browse boutiques and art galleries.

RTA President Jeff Parrett. "For anyone
