

Registration Open For 2017 RTA Symposium & Technical Conference In San Diego

Slated for Oct. 30-Nov. 3 at the Manchester Grand Hyatt San Diego, the conference brings attendees together for networking, industry exhibits, education, the latest purchasing plans by the Class 1 railroads, status updates on major railroad engineering projects, research and development initiatives and more.

site of the RTA Conference.

The hotel offers a spectacular waterfront resort-style setting, complete with shopping, dining and entertainment venues.

Day 1 – Relax, Enjoy & Connect

Tuesday, Oct. 31, is a day for catching up with friends and making new ones during activities like the Annual RTA Golf Tournament, which will be held at scenic Maderas Golf Club. Maderas has been a ZAGAT top-rated golf course in San Diego for the last seven years.

Optional activities for the day include behind the scenes, private events held just for RTA attendees at the San Diego Zoo. One event is a private tour and the other event is an interactive visit with a zookeeper and the animals.

Another tour option is a guided, behind-the-scenes visit to the USS Midway, where noted author Scott McGaugh will share his knowledge of the historic ship. This event

will be followed by lunch in Old Town San Diego.

Later, RTA's guest-sponsored hospitality suites will open from 3-6 p.m., prior to highly anticipated President's Reception, held from 5:30-7:00 p.m.

Day 2 – Getting Down To Business

Wednesday, Nov. 1, will start early with the RTA General Business Session and Welcome from RTA President Tim Ries of Koppers Inc. Ries will open the meeting and move into the Economic Session, where analyst Tony Hatch will provide a rail system outlook for 2018. Judd Johnson of Hardwood Market Report will update attendees on hardwood production and consumption.

Quality control will be the topic of the next session, with presenters including UPRR's Nate Irby, NS's Brad Crawford, Kim Merritt of Southern Pine Inspection Bureau, Jeremy Williams of Timber Products Inspection and Don Guillen of AAR.

Following a networking and exhibition break, lunch will include keynote addresses from Dallin Brooks of the Western Wood

Preservers Institute, who will discuss putting preserved wood back on the forest products industry map. Linda Bauer Darr of ASLRRRA will provide an update on short line and regional railroads and lead a panel discussion on short line and regional railroads.

The Engineering Forum, where executives from AREMA and Class 1 railroads will provide updates on their latest construction and maintenance projects, will follow the short line session.

The evening will officially close with the Annual RTA Banquet and Awards Ceremony, where a "Top Gun" theme will take center stage. Comedian Mark Cordes, otherwise known as "The Spouse Whisperer", will provide entertainment following recognition of RTA's John Mabry Forestry Scholarship winners and winners of RTA's Branding Hammer, Broad Axe, and Silver Saw awards.

Day 3 – The Environment, Research & Purchasing Plans

Thursday, Nov. 2, will start with a session on the environment, tie disposal and contractor topics.

This session will be followed by a discussion of the latest R&D developments affecting the wood tie industry.

Perhaps one of the most highly anticipated sessions of the conference is the Class 1 Railroad Purchasing Forum. Moderated by Kristine Storm of the Genesee & Wyoming Railroad, this forum allows Class 1 railroads to share their purchasing plans for the coming year. Prepare for this session to be

a standing-room-only event, so plan to be present beginning at 8 a.m. to avoid missing any of the important information shared.

"I encourage all RTA members to attend this important conference," advised RTA Executive Director Jim Gauntt. "If you are part of the wood tie industry and want to stay on top of the latest research and development initiatives, purchasing plans, economic and procurement issues, and so much more, there is no better place to stay informed than this conference. Golfers will delight in the RTA Golf Tournament at the Maderas Golf Club on Tuesday, Oct. 31.

A Johnny Miller course, Maderas has been rated by Zagat as the top golf course in San Diego County for seven consecutive years.

Maderas Golf Club combines beauty with challenge as it winds through the cliffs, rock outcroppings, creeks and forests of the inland hill country of north San Diego.

Golfers will leave the hotel at 7:00 a.m. for the Golf Tournament to be held from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Cost is \$245 for registering prior to the event. Registration at the event costs \$295. Transportation, breakfast and lunch are included in the fee.

Also on Tuesday, attendees may choose from two events at the San Diego Zoo. Each event will operate simultaneously from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., so you will not be able to participate in both tours.

The first event is the Behind-The-Scenes private tour of the zoo. From the private zoo bus, you will enjoy a personally narrated tour that encompasses a large portion of the huge compound.

You will enjoy sights such as the Polar Bear Plunge, the African Plains, Cat Canyon and more.

During this extensive tour, you will be given the history of the zoo and learn about some of the groundbreaking advances in animal care that have been made in San Diego and how those advances have been implemented in zoos around the world.

When you disembark from the bus, you will be escorted behind the scenes by your experienced tour guide and taken to an area normally closed to the public. Here, you will experience up-close encounters with the animals.

The private tour is \$195 if paid prior to the event or \$225 at the event if not sold out. This tour can accommodate up to 40 people.

The second zoo event, called Animals In Action, allows participants to see animals in action. Join the zoo's trainers as they encourage natural animal behaviors. Someone from the audience might even be invited to join in a training session.

Bring your camera to this interactive experience, as the animals will come to you for an up-close view.

The trainers will also take participants behind the scenes to feed, touch or help train some of the zoo's animal ambassadors.

The Animals in Action interactive event is \$275 if paid prior to the event or \$305 at the event. There is a 40-person maximum.

Behind The Scenes USS Midway Tour



On Tuesday, Oct. 31, History buffs will especially appreciate the Behind the Scenes Tour of The *USS Midway* aircraft carrier with noted author Scott McGaugh.

Commissioned in 1945, the *USS Midway* served during the Korean and Vietnam conflicts and in the Persian Gulf until retired in 1992. The namesake ship of her class, she was the first carrier built too large to pass through the Panama Canal.

The adventure includes a private tour of areas not open to the public on the carrier.

Scott McGaugh, noted author of "Midway Magic" and "*USS Midway* – America's Shield," will lead the tour.

Lunch is included as part of the Midway Tour and will take participants to Old Town San Diego to capture the "Spirit of Mexico" at its best at Casa Guadalajara.
